Inspiring future STEM leaders! More than 30 sophomores and juniors from Mastery High School in Camden visited American Water's headquarters to learn about careers in water utility. The students had a successful hands-on workshop learning from many water industry professionals working in engineering, water quality, human resources, talent acquisition, and more.

Last December, The American Water Charitable Foundation provided Junior Achievement of NJ (JANJ) with a One Water Street grant to support the organization's career exploration workshop series. Junior Achievement of NJ's Career Success Workshop is a statewide initiative that connects high schools, higher education, and the business community in an effort to close the employability skills gap, build New Jersey's future workforce pipeline, and prepare thousands of students for success after graduation and a bright future.



Giving Back is as Vital as Water!
