Donations nearly tripled for the year, up from \$46,150 in 2023.

"Pennsylvania American Water takes great pride in supporting the needs of our customers and the communities we serve," said Gary Lobaugh, the company's director of government and external affairs. "Our partnerships with local food banks allow us to provide impactful contributions in an effort to address food insecurity, and they align well with other resources we provide, like our H2O Help to Others customer assistance program, which offers grants and monthly discounts to disadvantaged customers who qualify."

As limited access to food is an ongoing issue, Pennsylvania American Water made contributions to food banks throughout the year, with an emphasis on supporting organizations that work directly with those in need within its service territory.
