New Jersey American Water provides these simple rules when driving through work zones:

- Stay Alert. Pay attention to flaggers, workers, and equipment, and be prepared for sudden stops.
- Slow down. Follow all posted speed limits and adjust for traffic flows and weather conditions.
- Give yourself some space. Leave at least two seconds of braking room between other vehicles.
