West Virginia American Water Invests \$400,000 in Bluefield Infrastructure Upgrades

Bluefield, W.Va., (April 28, 2025) – West Virginia American Water is pleased to announce an infrastructure upgrade project in Mercer County. As part of our ongoing commitment to providing safe, clean and reliable water service, the company will be investing approximately \$400,000 in infrastructure improvements in Bluefield.

The project began on April 21st and will include replacing 1,480 feet of aging water main with 2-inch PVC main on Valley View Avenue, from Memorial Avenue to Oak Grove Avenue, and on Shady Avenue, near Bellevue Avenue to the end of Shady Avenue. Infrastructure projects like this help to improve service reliability for customers by helping to reduce service disruptions and improve fire flows.

Crews will work Monday through Friday between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., and traffic restrictions will be in place during construction. The project is expected to be completed by the end of June, and the final street restoration will be completed in the summer of 2025.

This infrastructure upgrade project is part of West Virginia American Water's plan to invest more than \$104 million in infrastructure upgrades across the state in 2025. In addition, these projects help support the economic health of the communities served by West Virginia American Water. Economic impact studies show that for every \$1 million invested in water infrastructure, upwards of 15 jobs are generated throughout local economies.

Over the past decade, West Virginia American Water has invested over \$736 million, in infrastructure projects and capital upgrades to address aging infrastructure across the Mountain State, including more than 168 miles of new water main. Crews will work as quickly as possible to shorten the length of these temporary inconveniences.
