Our team members have a passion for supporting their local communities – it's who we are. And through our companywide [Meijer Team Gives](#) program, our [Team Member Resource Groups](#) (TMRGs) also have the opportunity to make an impact around causes important to them. For our TMRG, MOSAIC, they chose The Diatribe in Grand Rapids, Mich. and The Joseph Project in Gross Pointe Farms, Michigan, donating \$5,000 to each organization for the most recent Meijer Team Gives program.

The Diatribe is a nonprofit community organization that provides arts education and mentorship to youth in Grand Rapids. Their mission is to inspire youth to achieve their full potential through creative expression. Our donation will help The Diatribe provide scholarships for students who otherwise could not afford their programming. Our continued support of The Diatribe helps ensure all children have access to arts education, regardless of their family's income.

The group's second donation went to The Joseph Project, a southeast Michigan-based organization that that connects human trafficking survivors with pro bono legal services. It is inspired by the Biblical account of history's earliest recorded survivor, Joseph, who transitioned from exploitation to empowerment with God's help.
