
More Than 20 Epic Pass Resorts Open for Spring Skiing & Snowboarding

Spring skiing and snowboarding is in full swing with longer days, warmer temperatures and fresh snow still falling. Across Vail Resorts owned and operated mountains, 21 resorts are still open for spring turns, pond skims, goggle tans and fresh tracks across the West, Rockies, East and Europe.

March Delivers Massive Snowfall and Epic Spring Events in the West

On the heels of its highest seven-day snow total (72 inches) since January 2021, North America's largest mountain resor**Whistler Blackcomb** continues to get dumped on, with 32 inches over the last seven days, 113 inches in March alone, and more in the forecast. All 8,171 skiable acres are open for guests, highlighted by a bevy of signature events and experiences, including:

The current season snowfall at **Stowe** has topped 300 inches, and it's still going strong. February brought historic snowfall totals—36 inches above average—leaving the base perfectly primed for epic spring skiing with more than 350 acres of skiing and riding. We're celebrating with the first annual Spring Bash and the return of the legendary Pond Skim on April 11 and 12.

With 3 inches of snow this week and more on the way, **Okemo** will take you from powder days to pond skims at the <u>Slush Cup</u> and Spring Party.

Mount Snow kicked off spring with <u>Reggaefest</u>—a weekend filled with shredding, live music, the sink-or-swim Pond Skim and the Duct Tape Derby. With fresh snow still falling, spring turns are here, and there's still time to make the most of the season.

We're still seeing snow at **Hunter Mountain**. Deck out in denim for the legendary Annual Denim Dash Pond Skim. Celebrate the sunshine and longer days with spring skiing laps.

Mount Sunapee's final day of the season is Sunday, April 6, and the resort has plenty of terrain available for spring skiing and riding thanks to recent investments in snowmaking. Nothing says spring like making buttery turns with stunning views of Lake Sunapee, or skimming across Mount Sunapee's 90-foot human-made pond at the <u>Slush Cup</u>, or tapping into your creative side at the <u>Cardboard Sled Race</u>.

Celebrate spring at **Attitash** at the annual <u>70's Spring Sendoff</u> with Motor Booty Affair on Saturday, March 29. Attitash just received 4 inches of snow with more on the way this weekend.

With 3 inches of snow already this week, **Wildcat** has another foot of snow in the forecast over the weekend, and over 2,100 vertical feet of advanced skiing and riding for those looking for a spring adventure.

In Pennsylvania, after 101 incredible operating days, skiers and riders can soak up spring vibes with goggle tans, last laps, and a Spring Break Luau at **Seven Springs** on Saturday, March 29.

Spring Skiing Farther Afield: Last Minute Wanderlust in Switzerland

Spring skiing at Switzerland's Andermatt-Sedrun and Crans-Montana Mountain Resort offers a unique escape set among high alpine vistas and cobblestoned streets. Warm spring days and uncrowded slopes pair perfectly with outdoor terraces and fine Swiss dining.

Book a last-minute trip to the Caprices Festival, the iconic electronic music event with an avant-garde program set 2,200 meters above sea level. The event will take place April 4-6 and 11-13 in **Crans-Montana**.

At **Andermatt-Sedrun**, celebrate spring with the legendary Waterslide Contest and Season End Party Milez on April 5. Pond skim straight to an exhilarating apres-ski party with the Dieni Milez chairlift spinning until 7 p.m. Stay for the High Peak Festival on April 11. This musical spectacle will surround you with majestic peaks and pulsating beats, right in the heart of the Swiss Alps.
